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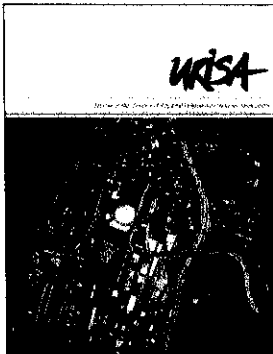
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Cover: The cover aerial photograph shows downtown Seattle, Washington, with the Kingdome sports arena at left center. Puget Sound is in the upper left (northwest) corner of the image. It was taken in April, 1995 by Aerial Image Technology (Portland, Oregon) from a Cessna 172 aircraft flying 12,000 feet above sea level. The image was used for a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers wetlands project.

Aerial Image Technology used a Nikon F3 35mm camera, a 28mm lens, and Kodak Ektachrome 100 film. The slide was then scanned by Northwoods Personally Yours in Woodruff, Wisconsin. They used Kodak's PIW (Photo CD) computer system to scan and write the image onto a Photo CD, a process which is described in the article on page 58. The Photo CD disc was supplied by Kodak Aerial Systems.
